India: Ban on GM crops' field trials not the solution, adequate regulation needed

The interim report of the <u>Technical Expert Committee</u> appointed by the Supreme Court for help in hearing a petition to ban <u>genetically-modified organisms</u> makes a lot of sense, except on three counts. These are: one, a blanket ban of 10 years on field trials of transgenic food crops; two, a blanket ban on field trials of transgenics in those crops for which India is a centre of origin or diversity; and three, its presumption of a conflict of interest between regulatory and developmental roles.
