## GMO labeling laws on deck in the Midwest

The following is an edited excerpt.

Just south of Hermann, Mo., <u>Swiss Meat and Sausage Co.</u> processes 2 million pounds of meat a year — everything from cattle to hogs to buffalo to elk.

And everything gets a label.

"No antibiotics added, raised without added hormones, all natural, minimally processed," Glenn Brandt, the production manager for Swiss Meat, reads from a hefty roll of hickory smoked beef sausage stickers.

What this label does not indicate, however, is whether or not the sausage contains genetically modified organisms, or GMOs.

"The Non-GMO label is such a gray area as far as labeling — what you can say and what you can't say," Brandt said.

But that gray area is quickly becoming more colorful.
