New generation of herbicide-tolerant crops face regulatory delays

The following is an editorial summary of a longer story.

Monsanto and Dow Chemical face delays in selling biotech crops engineered to survive older weedkillers after the U.S. Department of Agriculture announced increased scrutiny of the genetically modified plants. The new crops will be evaluated in separate environmental impact statements — a longer and more intensive review process than the environmental assessments previously used by the USDA to evaluate biotech crops.

The GLP has written previously about the dangers of over-regulation for biotech crops and foods with regards to the AquAdvantage GM salmon and the so-called "Monsanto Protection Act."
