George Church wonders why you haven't had your genome sequenced yet

There was a fascinating moment at Google's Cambridge office when Harvard geneticist George Church asked how many people in a crowd of about 150 had had their genomes sequenced.

Not a single person raised a hand.

And this was a room full of folks who had turned out to hear Church keynote an Xconomy event called Healthcare Gets Personal — people with a keen interest in the future of medicine.

"I consider this one of the greatest paradoxes of our time," Church said.
