Last fall, the legendary musician <u>called on fans to boycott Starbucks</u> because it sided with the agribusiness conglomerate in a looming <u>fight over GMO labeling in Vermont</u>. And on Monday, Rolling Stone reported that <u>Young is teaming up with up-and-coming band Promise of the Real</u> to record an album called "The Monsanto Years," which will be full of songs critical of the company.

According to a press representative at Warner Brothers Records, Young will release "The Monsanto Years," and promote it on a joint tour this summer.

The album will gain some anti-corporate credibility from two of the members of Promise of the Real: Lukas and Micah Nelson, the sons of Willie Nelson. Nelson *père*is an <u>outspoken critic of Monsanto</u> and other large agribusinesses, which have been accused of putting profits ahead of human health and environmental sustainability in the development of new crop varieties and agricultural chemicals.
