

Mandatory GMO labeling of foods overwhelmingly defeated in Canadian Parliament

Members of the Canadian Parliament voted against approving mandatory labeling of genetically modified [GMO] foods in a vote in the House of Commons [May 17].

The private members bill [C-291](#) — introduced by Pierre-Luc Dusseault, the NDP (New Democratic Party) MP for Sherbrooke, Quebec — was [defeated](#) by a significant margin, with 67 yeas, and 216 nays.
