Video: Ethical considerations when using CRISPR gene editing

Massive co-founder Nadja Oertelt interviewed Caltech biologist and winner of the 1975 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine, David Baltimore, for this animated piece. Baltimore helped assemble and run the <u>Asilomar Conference on Recombinant DNA</u>, held the same year he won the Nobel. His work along with others at MIT led to the discovery of reverse transcriptase and retroviruses, eventually up-ending a central dogma in molecular biology of information flow within the cell.
