## Even as public opposition to glyphosate grows, some French winemakers denounce ban of Monsanto's Roundup Pro 360

On January 15, 2019, the Administrative Court of Lyon [France] banned [Monsanto's] "Roundup Pro 360," a herbicide containing glyphosate. The court canceled the marketing authorization for this product, saying it should "be considered as a substance whose carcinogenic potential for humans is assumed."

This product is widely used in the wine industry. In the Loir-et-Cher, for example, winegrowers denounced this quick decision and wondered how they will be able to find a substitute for glyphosate. Those who chose to do without admitted that their production costs are 30% higher than those of their peers, and wondered if the general public is willing to pay more for everything it consumes.

[French President] Emmanuel Macron has committed to permanently banning glyphosate in France in 2021. In the meantime, the use of [Roundup Pro 360] is prohibited....and individuals can not buy anymore as of January 1, 2019....
