

FDA releases free 'Feed your mind' curriculum to teach students about GMOs

[September 29], the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has posted additional ["Feed Your Mind"](#) consumer education materials. Developed in partnership with the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Environmental Protection Agency and [launched earlier](#) this year, "Feed Your Mind" is a consumer education initiative to provide science-based information on genetically engineered foods, commonly called GMOs or genetically modified organisms.
